#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

#### M. Rampacek:

A resident at Block 73 Lot 25 would like to widen their driveway and the zoning officer discovered that the property that the homeowner would like to utilize is listed on the zoning map as an easement to the property behind them known as Block 73 Lot 22. The Board may need to sign a resolution to remove this easement from Half Acre Road known as Block 73 Lot 25 to the residence on Antoinette Court, known as Block 73 Lot 22. It was believed that possibly many years ago this easement was created for access to the old, now non-existent pit where Antoinett Court is now.

Attorney Youssouf stated that he needs to see the deed to determine who owns the easement, may need a title search, homeowner must perform the title search.

Burden falls on the homeowner.

Mayor stated that she will discuss this matter with the Borough Zoning Officer.

Chief Rampacek received a phone call from the Chief of Monroe 23 requesting to borrow an engine while their apparatus is all out for repairs. The Chief of Monroe 23 said they may need it for approximately 60-90 days. The Board discussed the situation in detail and opted not to lend one of our engines to Monroe 23.
